TOP TIPS TO AID PERFORMANCE AFTER TRAVEL



Pre-Flight

Adjust your

Adjust your sleep routine

30–60 mins earlier when flying east, or later when flying west, in the few days before your flight

2

Arrive for your flight well rested

Lack of sleep makes travel fatigue and jet lag worse

Arrive for your flight well hydrated

Drink plenty of water and avoid caffeine and alcohol

Eat W

Prepare small healthy snacks like fresh or dried fruit, energy bars or unsalted nuts to take with you. Drink plenty of water or juices after check-in

Prepare a travel pack

Water bottle to refill, pillow, eye mask, ear plugs, noise cancelling headphones, healthy snacks, hand sanitisers, compression socks

On board

Adjust your watch to the new local time

Eat, drink, rest, sleep and nap on that time

2

Drink regularly and refill your water bottle

250–300 ml of water every hour to stay hydrated — avoid caffeine and alcohol

3

Stay mobile

Walk around the cabin and perform stretches every hour, wear compression socks

4

Eat Well

Try to select meals higher in protein to promote alertness or to induce sleep opt for meals higher in carbohydrates

Z

Maximise rest and sleep

Wear your eye mask and earplugs/ noise cancelling headphones and avoid the use of electronic devices in the hour before scheduled sleep

Post-Flight

1

Hydrated

Keep hydrated with plenty of water

2

Eat smart

Eat palatable, familiar foods to prevent GI issues, eat as close to local meal times as possible

3

Nap strategically

To keep alert and recover any lost sleep, limit naps to 30 mins (set an alarm) to prevent disrupting sleep at night

4

Seek natural sunlight

When travelling west seek natural light during the early evening hours; when travelling east seek natural light during the early hours of the morning

5

Exercise

A light exercise session post-flight will help reduce mobility restriction due to cramped flight conditions. Combine an exercise session with light exposure
